



## Midway ISD SHAC Minutes

Meeting Date: October 19, 2022

The October SHAC meeting began at 4:03.

1. Anne-Marie Zellers, Coordinator for Student Support Services and last year's co-chair, opened the meeting with a review of SHAC's duties and topics covered in 2021-2022 meetings.

SHAC spent time last year reviewing sex education curriculum and made a recommendation to the Board in May to adopt "Choosing the Best". The following is an excerpt from the letter to the MISD School Board from the 2021-2022 MISD SHAC:

*The Midway ISD SHAC worked with the Coordinator for Health Services, members of the Curriculum Department, Middle School and High School teachers, parents, the local Health Department, and other community agencies/resources to review the current sex-education curriculum, Living Well Aware, and to review new curriculum options. After months of review, the SHAC voted unanimously to recommend to the Board the sex-education curriculum Choosing the Best. The SHAC also values the partnership with Unbound and Dr. Soo Battle for presentations to students about preventing child abuse, dating violence, and human trafficking.*



*State law requires that instructional materials for sex education and prevention of child abuse, family and dating violence, and sex trafficking be adopted by school boards on the recommendation of SHACs and for the Board to take action on the recommendation “by a record vote at a public meeting” Tex. Educ. Code § 28.004(e-1).*

2. Dr. Odajima, Assistant Superintendent for Administrative Services, presented information about school safety, summer safety audits, weekly door checks, and duties performed by our School Resource Officers. She also presented information about discipline data, trends, and the increase in drug violations and fights on campuses. Dr. Odajima discussed the many District supports and new community partnerships that have been developed to educate our students on drug abuse, prevention, and treatment. For the 2022-23 school year, Midway ISD has partnered with Cenikor and the Baylor Department of Educational Psychology to specifically provide drug prevention information and treatment options for Midway students.
  - a. Very Important Parent Nights (VIP)
    - i. October 20, 2022 School Safety
    - ii. November 10, 2022 Drug Prevention, Education, and Treatment
  - b. STOPit App-Anonymous reporting app loaded on all student Ipads 4th-12th grades. Parent Holly Trail asked if the District could send a communication through Parent Square so parents will know they can also make anonymous reports about school safety online. The STOPit app will also be discussed at the parent night on October 20th.
3. Dee Ann Kleypas, Coordinator for Health Services, discussed the recent information in the news about school districts having Narcan on campus in case of a drug overdose on a school campus. The SRO's already carry it on them, but Dee Ann said the nurses will plan to have Narcan in their offices as well.

4. Rudy Frett, Director of Food Services, shared information about the new fingerprint system used in the cafeteria. At this time, the new system is only available on a couple of Elementary campuses. Rudy also discussed the shortage of staff for the cafeterias. He is adjusting menu items on campuses until they can hire the staff needed to provide more food options (snack bar).
